# CYCHLORPHINE

## What is Cychlorphine?

**Also known as 'N-Propionitrile Chlorphine'**

- A strong opioid that has been found in the Tennessee street drug supply
- Often mixed with other drugs (like fentanyl or heroin)
- Not easy to recognize or identify
- Has been present in fatal overdoses in Tennessee

## Naloxone & Cychlorphine

- Naloxone works to reverse overdoses that involve opioid including cychlorphine
- Follow standard overdose response steps

## Risks with Cychlorphine

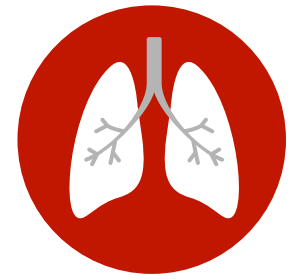
- Causes heavy sedation or 'nodding out'
- Can slow or stop breathing
- May feel like "zenes" (nitazenes)
- Often mixed with, or may be sold as, other drugs, including
- Increases the chance of overdose death

# WHAT YOU CAN DO TO PROTECT YOURSELF FROM

## How to be Prepared

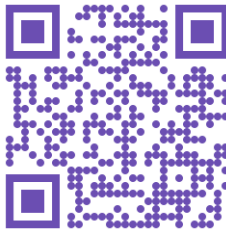
- Go slow & do not use alone
- Carry naloxone & know how to use it
- Know how to rescue breathing to support breathing in an overdose



## How to Respond

- ❑ Check for responsiveness
  - Shake & call out to the person
  - Perform a center chest rub
- ❑ Check for breathing
- ❑ Give naloxone every 2-3 mins until they are breathing
- ❑ Call 911 & stay with them
- ❑ Start rescue breathing
